ESTATE TRANSFER PLANNING

(Concerning individuals with intellectual disabilities)

Information Session

November 21st 2017 7: 00 PM

During this 3-hour presentation notary Laurent Fréchette will talk about the delicate subject of estate transfer planning for families with a relative living with an intellectual disability or an Autism Spectrum disorder (ASD).

Through concrete examples, this presentation will help to:

- Familiarize oneself with wills in order to better plan for one's passing as a parent.
- Identify areas requiring reflection in the process leading to an estate transfer
- Propose a unique will-model adapted to the particular needs related to individuals with intellectual disability
- Present the concept of Human mandate
- Find out about wills and protection mandates in the event of incapacity. This segment will focus on legal and financial aspects, but will also refer to human aspects.
- Provide tips on how to be better prepare when meeting a notary.

An authority figure in his field for more than 20 years, M^e Laurent Fréchette is known for his expertise regarding parents who have children with an intellectual disability or ASD. He collaborates with many other notaries, gives conferences throughout the province and is regularly interviewed by media. Furthermore, the Chambre des notaires published an article about him in the August 2017 "Entracte magazine".

SHADOWING-BABYSITTING SERVICE

Autisme Montréal provides a shadowingbabysitting service.

In order to benefit from our services, you must meet various criteria:

- You must be member of Autisme Montréal, live on the island of Montreal and have a child with a diagnos of ASD (or in the process of obtaining the diagnosis)
- Offer the shadow the minimum wage of \$11.25/hour (the recommended wage varies between \$11.25 and \$13.00 per hour).
- requesting a minimum service of three hours is mandatory (even if you need the shadow for less than that period of time, you still have to pay for three hours of service).
- Outing expenses and transportation during the shadowing for both the shadow and the child must also be paid by the families.

To register, the family must contact the community worker at: (514) 524-6114, extension 3162. You will be asked to give as much information as possible about your child (interests, behavior, etc.) and to specify your needs regarding the request (days, requested hours, type of desired services). We will then send you a document entitled "Child's profile" that must be completed and returned to us so that we can provide the shadow with relevant information regarding your child.
