AUTISM AND RELATED NEUROLOGICAL ISSUES

Neurology, as it relates to autism, is often more accurately referred to as neuroimmunology. The immune system and nervous system are intricately related and abnormalities in both are often found in individuals with autism.

Dr. Cindy Schneider will present an overview of basic neurology, outline many of the neurological findings associated with autism, and explain the relationship between neurological symptoms and immune dysfunction. Evidence of neurological inflammation and immune dysregulation in autism will be reviewed and treatment options will be discussed.

Some of the topics that will be presented include Cerebral Folate Deficiency (CFD), as well as seizures/epilepsy, neurotoxins, the endocannabinoid system and the use of cannabidiol (CBD) products, hormonal influences on the nervous system, and mitochondrial disease. Optimizing neurological function can only be achieved when the immune, metabolic, and nutritional needs of a person with autism are fully addressed and this will be the focus of this symposium.

SHADOWING-BABYSITTING SERVICE

Autisme Montréal provides a shadowing-babysitting service. To take advantage of this service, you must meet certain requirements:

- Be a member of Autisme Montréal, live on the Island of Montreal and be the parent of a child with a diagnosis of ASD (or about to be obtained);
- Offer the shadow a minimum hourly rate of \$12.50 (the recommended hourly rate is between \$12.50 and \$15.00);
- Submit a request which cannot be for less than 3 consecutive hours of work. Even if you need the shadow for less than that period of time, you will still have to pay for 3 hours;
- The family must also pay for the outing and transportation expenses for both the shadow and the child;

Please note that you have to make a request for this service at least 2 weeks in advance so that we may be able to better meet your needs. Furthermore, the parents must contact us should they wish to cancel their request. We suggest that the family contact us once the first service has been completed to give us their comments.

Children and teenagers with an autism spectrum disorder often have comorbidities that may sometimes be the cause of great suffering and have an impact on daily functioning. Medication can be used to help them and allow them to benefit from strategies implemented for them. During this presentation, we will talk about these comorbidities and the medication groups that may be used. Of course, we will also focus on some side effects that are sometimes more pronounced for our children and teenagers with ASD, while maintaining the principle: "most of all do not harm".


BIOGRAPHY

DO YOU OWN THE TOURIST AND LEISURE COMPANION STICKER (TLCS)?

The Leisure Companion Card (LCC) now replaces the TLCS, a program that has been existing for more than 20 years. You must replace your TLCS by qualifying for the LCC as soon as possible at www.carteloisir.ca. You must keep your TLCS until you obtain your LCC.

There are 2 ways to apply, depending on your situation:

Are you eligible for any of the government programs, measures for people with disabilities, or have one of the recognized cards?

Fill out the simplified form and attach the proof requested and your photo.

You meet the criteria for LCC, but you are not eligible for any of the recognized programs, measures and cards?

Fill in the form with questionnaire. Make sure it is signed by a health and social services professional that will attest to the accuracy of the information provided and attach your photo.

We would like to remind you that current holders of the Tourist and Leisure Companion Sticker (TLCS) have until October 2020 to replace their TLCS for the LCC.

NEWS FROM THE DOCUMENTATION CENTER

L'intervention précoce en Autisme pour les parents avec le modèle de Denver, by S. J. Rogers, G. Dawson and L. A. Vismara

This book, a real support tool for everyday life, presents the Denver model (or ESDM), which was developed to answer the specific needs of very young children, by proposing an optimal stimulation of their abilities. This developmental and behavioral approach focuses on learning in a positive socio-emotional context.

L'estime de soi et l'autiste, by Brigitte Harrisson and Lise St-Charles

The authors explain that the reality of autistic individuals must be at the heart of the interventions to help them build their identity and self-esteem. This book demonstrates that the 2 most important aspects of self-esteem for autistic individuals, **ability** in several areas that are important to them and **validation** from significant persons, will help them develop a social sense.

Solving Behavior Problems in Autism – Improving Communication with Visual Strategies, by Linda A. Hodgdon

This book is a resource guaranteed to provide practical help for every parent or educator who faces problem behaviors and self-management challenges of students with autism spectrum disorders. It includes the *Guide for Assessing Behavior Situations*.
